# ACTION ITEMS:

- a1. Approval of High Cost & Low Income Committee Meeting Minutes of October 27, 2008 and December 10, 2008. On a motion duly made and seconded, the Committee approved the minutes as written of the Committee meetings of October 27, 2008 and December 10, 2008.
- a2. Approval of 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter 2009 and 2009 Annual High Cost and Low Income Support Mechanisms Programmatic Budgets. Mr. Belden introduced this item to the Committee and recommended that discussion of this item be conducted in Executive Session because a procurement matter was included for consideration by the Committee as part of the budget. In accordance with the approved criteria and procedures for conducting USAC Board and committee business in *Executive Session*, Mr. Capozzi

recommended that this discussion be conducted in *Executive Session* because this matter relates to USAC's *procurement strategy and contract administration*.

On a motion duly made and seconded, the Committee adopted the following resolutions:

**RESOLVED**, that the USAC High Cost and Low Income Committee determines that discussion of the Approval of 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter 2009 and 2009 Annual High Cost and Low Income Support Mechanisms Programmatic Budgets shall be conducted in *Executive Session*.

a3. Approval of 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter 2009 High Cost and Low Income Support Mechanisms Demand Projections for the January 30, 2009 FCC Filing. Ms. Majcher introduced this item to the Committee. In response to a question from Mr. Lubin concerning the typical large variances in prior period adjustments for this quarter each year and the status of USAC's recommendation to the FCC concerning accounting for the adjustment, Mr. Belden replied that the FCC has not yet responded to USAC's proposal and USAC staff bring this matter to the attention of Commission staff on a regular basis.

On a motion duly made and seconded and after discussion, the Committee adopted the following resolution:

**RESOLVED**, that the USAC High Cost & Low Income Committee, having reviewed at its meeting on January 26, 2009, a summary of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter 2009 High Cost and Low Income Support Mechanisms demand estimates, hereby directs USAC staff to proceed with the required January 30, 2009 filing to the FCC on behalf of the Committee. Staff may make adjustments if the total variance for both support mechanisms combined is equal to or less than \$10 million and, with approval of the Committee Chair, may make adjustments if the total variance for both support mechanisms combined is equal to or less than \$15 million.

**a4. Recommendation for Annual Election of Committee Chair and Vice Chair.** Mr. Lubin introduced this item to the Committee. Mr. Jortner nominated Mr. Lubin to be Committee chair and Ms. Boyle nominated Mr. Gillan to be Committee Vice Chair.

On a motion duly made and seconded and after discussion, the Committee adopted the following resolution:

**RESOLVED,** that the USAC High Cost & Low Income Committee recommends that the USAC Board of Directors elect Joel Lubin as Chair and Joseph Gillan as Vice Chair of the Committee for a term that begins immediately upon the adoption of this resolution by the Board and ends when a successor to the Chair and/or Vice Chair has been elected, when the Chair or Vice Chair resigns from the Committee or the Board, is removed by resolution of the Board, or the Chair and/or Vice Chair's Board term expires. a5. Action on 14 High Cost Support Mechanism Beneficiary Compliance Attestation Audit Reports. Mr. Scott introduced this item to the Committee, noting that including the reports submitted to the Committee for review today, a total of 65 FCC Office of Inspector General (OIG) USF audit program Round 2 reports will have been reviewed with approximately 300-330 more reports to be reviewed. Mr. Lubin asked that the reports be prioritized so that the carriers that were audited in Round 2 and who will also be audited in Round 3 will receive copies of their final Round 2 audit reports as soon as possible.

During discussion, on a motion duly made and seconded, the Committee voted to lay the resolution on the table while it discussed an audit finding for a number of High Cost Support Mechanism beneficiaries that certain beneficiaries are failing to comply with the requirement in 47 C.F.R. § 54.201(d)(2) that the beneficiaries advertise the availability of services supported by universal service as set forth 47 C.F.R. § 54.101(a). After discussion, the Committee determined that staff should request guidance from the FCC on the requirements of Section 54.201(d)(2). On a motion duly made and seconded, the Committee then voted to take the resolution off the table for further consideration.

An amendment to the resolution was moved and seconded, and the Committee adopted the following resolution:

**RESOLVED**, that the USAC High Cost & Low Income Committee having reviewed the 14 High Cost Support Mechanism Beneficiary Compliance Attestation Audit reports as listed in Exhibit 1 to the issue paper and attached thereto, together with management's responses, accepts the recommendation of USAC management and hereby deems such reports final, provided that management revises its recommendation in the applicable reports that it intends to seek guidance from the Federal Communications Commission on proper application of the Commission's rules concerning advertising supported services as set forth in Sections 54.101(a) and 54.201(d) of the Commission's rules; and

**RESOLVED FURTHER**, that USAC management shall obtain such guidance from the Commission prior to taking action on the aforementioned audit finding for the 14 reports under consideration or future reports, and management shall inform auditees who had this audit finding in reports previously finalized that USAC shall take no action on such finding until Commission guidance is received. a6. Action on Four USAC Internal Audit Division Low Income Support Mechanism Limited Review Beneficiary Audit Reports. Mr. Scott introduced this item to the Committee.

On a motion duly made and seconded and after discussion, the Committee adopted the following resolution:

**RESOLVED**, that the USAC High Cost & Low Income Committee, having reviewed the USAC Internal Audit Division Low Income Support Mechanism beneficiary audit reports labeled LI2008LR008, LI2008LR009, LI2008LR010 and LI2008LR011, together with management's responses thereto, hereby accepts the recommendation of USAC management and hereby deems such reports final.

a7. Action on One USAC Internal Audit Division Low Income Support Mechanism Beneficiary Performance Audit Report. In accordance with the approved criteria and procedures for conducting USAC Board and committee business in *Executive Session*, Mr. Capozzi recommended that this matter be discussed in *Executive Session* because the report relates to *specific internal controls and/or confidential company data* that would constitute a discussion of internal rules and procedures.

On a motion duly made and seconded, the Committee adopted the following resolution:

**RESOLVED**, that the USAC High Cost & Low Income Committee determines that discussion of the USAC Internal Audit Division Low Income Support Mechanism Beneficiary Audit Report labeled LI2008BE001 shall be conducted in *Executive Session*.

# a2. Approval of 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter 2009 and 2009 Annual High Cost and Low Income Support Mechanisms Programmatic Budgets.

On a motion duly made and seconded and after discussion, the Committee adopted the following resolutions:

**RESOLVED,** that the USAC High Cost & Low Income Committee approves a 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter 2009 programmatic budget for the High Cost Support Mechanism of \$16.3 million and a 2009 annual High Cost Support Mechanism budget of \$51.8 million; and

**RESOLVED FURTHER**, that the USAC High Cost & Low Income Committee approves a 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter 2009 programmatic budget for the Low Income Support Mechanism of \$2.2 million and a 2009 annual Low Income Support Mechanism budget of \$8.7 million.

# ACTION ITEMS:

a3. Action on 48 High Cost Support Mechanism Beneficiary Compliance Attestation Audit Reports. Mr. Scott presented this item to the Committee noting that majority of the audits received an unqualified opinion with only one adverse opinion.

Mr. Jortner sought additional clarification between a qualified and unqualified opinion, noting that the monetary effect did not seem to be a clear indicator. Mr. Barash noted that the opinion is determined by the auditor and is based on the number and type of findings not just the monetary effect.

Mr. Feiss questioned those audits where the amount to be recovered was listed as To Be Determined and questioned when an actual amount would be identified. Ms. Majcher explained that in some cases carriers may be asked to re-file their data. The carriers are given 60 days to respond, if they do not, the amount listed in the audit report is collected. The final outcome is equal to or less than the recovery amount noted in the audit report. In other cases, there may be additional investigative work that USAC needs to complete or an issue could be pending clarification at the FCC. Mr. Jortner questioned if the Inspector General required recovery based documentation issues. Mr. Barash responded that in such instances, USAC has been directed to conduct further investigations.

Ms. Boyle and Mr. Jortner express concern that the Committee might be perceived as not being responsible should they deem an audit final when the recovery amount has not been finalized. Mr. Scott explained that when an auditor has identified findings and submitted a report, the beneficiary has included a response, and if necessary, USAC has incorporated a management response, then the audit work is complete. USAC may not agree with all of the auditors' findings, may need to complete additional investigations, or may need clarification from the FCC, but the report is still complete from the auditors' perspective. The auditors will not change an issued attestation audit report, unless there is a material error in the report. Mr. Lubin clarified that the Committee is deeming the work of the auditors as final, not USAC's work. Mr. Barash agreed that an adjustment would be made to the report to provide a clear understanding of the status of the audit.

Mr. Feiss noted that on audits with an unqualified opinion that the amount to be recovered is sometimes greater than the monetary effect. Ms. Majcher explained that the auditor may conduct a one month review of the line count. If there are problems with the line count, it would impact the entire quarter, not just one month, therefore, the recovery would be greater than the listed monetary effect.

Mr. Feiss shared feedback that some rural carriers have expressed concern that auditors conducted field visits a year ago but the carriers have not yet received a report. Mr. Barash indicated that USAC was sympathetic to the concern, noting the difficulty for those carriers audited consecutively year after year. Mr. Barash explained the unprecedented number of audits being conducted and the work involved for USAC and

committed to providing all companies who have audits pending with a status report and estimated date of completion.

On a motion duly made and seconded and after discussion, the Committee adopted the following resolution:

**RESOLVED**, that the USAC High Cost & Low Income Committee having reviewed the 48 High Cost Support Mechanism Beneficiary Compliance Attestation Audit reports as listed in Exhibit 1 to this issue paper and attached hereto, together with management's responses, accepts the recommendation of USAC management and hereby deems such reports final.

a4. Consideration of Modification to KPMG LLP Contract for Audit Services for Round 2 of the FCC Office of Inspector General USF Audit Program. **RESOLVED FURTHER**, that the USAC High Cost and Low Income Committee approves a 3rd Quarter 2009 programmatic budget for the Low Income Support Mechanism of \$2.5 million and a revised 2009 annual Low Income Support Mechanism budget of \$8.2 million.

a3. Approval of 3rd Quarter 2009 High Cost and Low Income Support Mechanisms Demand Projections for the May 1, 2009 FCC Filing. Ms. Majcher presented this item to the Committee. Mr. Lubin noted that payments to beneficiaries for the Interstate Common Line Support component of the High Cost Support Mechanism will increase over time as the number of wire-line customers decrease. Ms. Majcher stated that Low Income Support Mechanism benefit payments are up significantly from 1st Quarter 2009 due to new Eligible Telecommunications Carrier (ETC) designations being granted. Mr. Barash noted that this increase in demand will likely cause the Universal Service Fund contribution factor to increase.

On a motion duly made and seconded and after discussion, the Committee adopted the following resolution:

**RESOLVED**, that the USAC High Cost & Low Income Committee, having reviewed at its meeting on April 27, 2009, a summary of the 3rd Quarter 2009 High Cost and Low Income Support Mechanisms demand estimates, hereby directs USAC staff to proceed with the required May 1, 2009 filing to the FCC on behalf of the Committee. For CETCs filing cost data, the Commission has not yet received approval from the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) to collect CETC cost data pursuant to this exception.

Bergmann and Jacobs will be elected to the Board tomorrow and will automatically be appointed to the High Cost & Low Income Committee pursuant to FCC regulations as representatives of the commercial mobile radio service providers and low income consumers, respectively.)

- a14. Approval of High Cost & Low Income Committee Meeting Minutes of July 27, 2009, August 24, 2009, and October 1, 2009. On a motion duly made and seconded, the Committee approved the minutes, as written, of the Committee meetings July 27, 2009, August 24, 2009 and October 1, 2009. Messrs. Bergmann and Ellis did not vote on this item.
- a15. Approval of 1st Quarter 2010 High Cost and Low Income Support Mechanisms Programmatic Budgets and Information on the Estimated 2010 Annual Budgets.

Mr. Barash informed the Committee that USAC staff has revised the budget approval resolutions, beginning with this meeting, to provide separate approvals for the amount of funds required for this quarter's program operations costs and a separate amount for program expenses submitted to the FCC for collection in the upcoming quarter.

Mr. Belden presented the High Cost Program budget to the Committee, noting that the proposed High Cost Program administration budget is \$38.7 million less than the 2009 budget. This reduction is primarily due to the in-sourcing of High Cost Program operations from Telcordia, Inc.(a contractor that has been providing these services since April 2003) and replacement of the FCC Office of Inspector General (OIG) USF audit program with the proposed USAC Universal Service Support Mechanism Beneficiary and USF Contributor Compliance Audit Program (BCAP) and the Improper Payments Information Act (IPIA) assessment program.

In response to a question from Mr. Lubin concerning allocation of common costs to the High Cost Program, Mr. Belden explained the methodology for allocating USAC common costs to the programs.

Mr. Belden then presented the Low Income Program budget to the Committee, noting that the proposed budget is \$900,000 less than the 2009 budget, primarily dues to the insourcing of Low Income Program operations from Telcordia. Mr. Belden also noted that the proposed budget includes ramp-up costs for the proposed BCAP and IPIA assessment program.

On a motion duly made, seconded, and after discussion, the Committee adopted the following resolutions:

**RESOLVED,** that the USAC High Cost & Low Income Committee approves a 1st Quarter 2010 programmatic budget for the High Cost Support Mechanism of \$2.9 million; and

**RESOLVED FURTHER**, that the USAC High Cost & Low Income Committee directs USAC staff to submit a collection requirement of \$2.9 million for High Cost Support Mechanism administrative expenses in the required November 2, 2009 filing to the FCC on behalf of the Committee; and

**RESOLVED FURTHER**, that the USAC High Cost & Low Income Committee approves a 1st Quarter 2010 programmatic budget for the Low Income Support Mechanism of \$0.4 million; and **RESOLVED FURTHER**, that the USAC High Cost & Low Income Committee directs USAC staff to submit a collection requirement of \$0.4 million for Low Income Support Mechanism administrative expenses in the required November 2, 2009 filing to the FCC on behalf of the Committee.

Messrs. Bergmann and Ellis also voted to approve the resolutions.

a3. Approval of 1st Quarter 2010 High Cost and Low Income Support Mechanisms Demand Projections for the November 2, 2009 FCC Filing. Ms. Majcher presented this item to the Committee.

On a motion duly made, seconded, and after discussion, the Committee adopted the following resolution:

**RESOLVED**, that the USAC High Cost & Low Income Committee, having reviewed at its meeting on October 26, 2009, a summary of the 1st Quarter 2010 High Cost and Low Income Support Mechanisms demand estimates, hereby directs USAC staff to proceed with the required November 2, 2009 filing to the FCC on behalf of the Committee. Staff may make adjustments if the total variance for both support mechanisms combined is equal to or less than \$10 million and, with approval of the Committee Chair, may make adjustments if the total variance for both support mechanisms combined is equal to or less than \$15 million.

Messrs. Bergmann and Ellis also voted to approve the resolutions.

  - USAC submitted the Local Switching Support (LSS) average schedule formula to the FCC on September 28, 2009. The formula will be effective for the 2010 calendar year.
  - USAC staff continues to run parallel validations and testing of the new High Cost Program operations system in anticipation of retiring the legacy system by the end of October 2009.
  - Since the 3rd Quarter 2009 quarterly update, the FCC has not released any new orders affecting the High Cost Program or program beneficiaries.

- USAC staff has held three training sessions to assist companies with the process of filing the Low Income FCC Form 497 online. More than 350 company representatives participated in these sessions. USAC has received approximately 450 online submissions as of mid-September.
- Round 2 of the FCC Office of Inspector General (OIG) USF audit program consisted of 390 audits. As of September 15, 2009, 385 final audit reports have been reviewed by quality assurance personnel. USAC staff have initiated review and responded to 29 of the 323 Round 3 FCC OIG USF audit program audits. As of September 15, 2009, 322 preliminary draft reports had been delivered by the audit firms.
- i2. High Cost and Low Income Transition Update. Ms. Majcher presented this item to the Committee, noting that the transition of program operations support from Telcordia to USAC inhouse staff is well underway with projected completion in late November 2009.
