

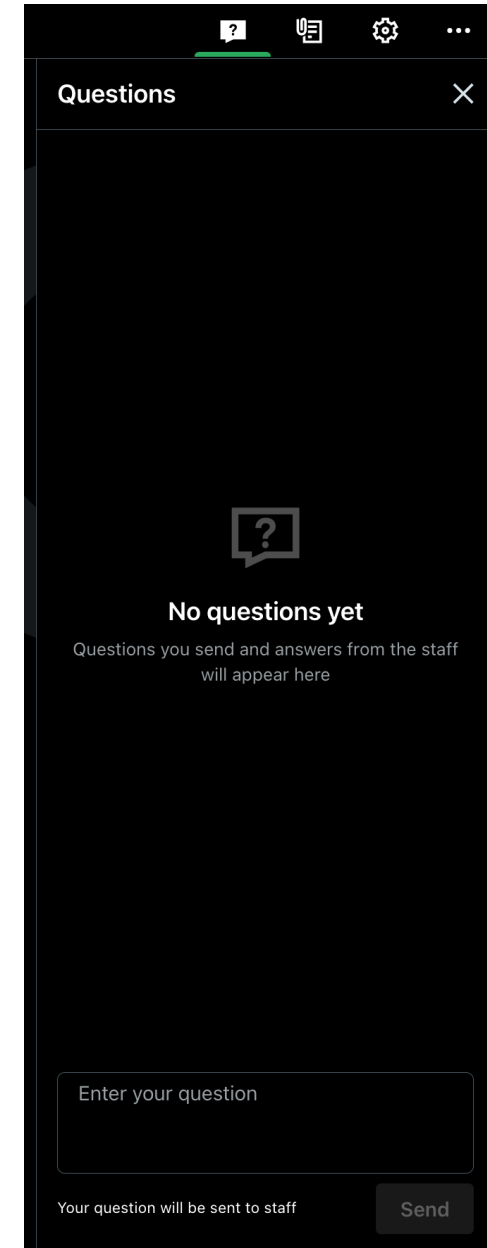

# High Cost and the Connect America Fund (CAF)

- The High Cost program ensures universal availability of essential and affordable telecommunications services in rural America. A centerpiece of the program is the Connect America Fund.
  - Subsidizes broadband to help close the digital divide in rural America
  - Consists of roughly a dozen modernized funds that give carriers fixed monthly payments to deploy and maintain robust communications networks – which provide voice service and broadband at required speeds – in eligible areas over defined timelines
  - Requires carriers with fixed broadband deployment obligations to connect a specific number of locations by interim and final milestone deadlines
  - Provides support to traditional rural phone companies, rural electric cooperatives, cable operators, wireless operators, wireless Internet service providers, satellite providers
  - Subjects carriers to extensive compliance framework to ensure required deployment

# Connect America Fund Compliance

USAC closely monitors carrier compliance with broadband deployment obligations to ensure that carriers are using CAF support to build out high-speed Internet access that meets minimum speed and latency standards to required location counts by relevant deployment milestone deadlines in rural areas eligible for funding.

Compliance process consists of several steps:

**HUBB Portal: Tracking Broadband Deployment**

**Verification Reviews: Confirming Broadband Deployment**

**Network Performance Testing: Measuring Speed and Latency**

(Carriers may also be subject to site visit audits following final deployment milestone cure periods.)

Compliance framework safeguards Connect America Fund accountability, transparency and integrity

# HUBB Portal: Tracking Broadband Deployment

- Carriers in modernized funds with defined fixed broadband build-out obligations must file data annually with the HUBB showing where they deployed service using CAF support in prior calendar year or certify “no locations” to upload (no deployment)
  - Includes annual certification to confirm that carrier’s filing activity for previous year is complete
  - Annual HUBB filing deadline is March 1 (March 2 in 2026)
- For every location deployed with CAF support, HUBB collects:
  - Date of deployment and speeds available
  - Lat/long coordinates and address or Location IDs from the [Broadband Serviceable Location Fabric](#)
    - Fabric is a single, standardized dataset of all locations in the U.S. where fixed broadband access is available or could be installed
    - Carriers in some newer CAF programs report deployment data using Location IDs from the Fabric that identify the locations where they must offer service

# HUBB Portal: Tracking Broadband Deployment

- HUBB performs automated, real-time data validation checks and only accepts locations that pass these checks:
  - Checks that lat/long of reported location fall within area eligible for funding or that Fabric Location ID is on list of required locations where a carrier must deploy service
  - Checks that the location is not a duplicate of one already submitted
  - Checks that date of deployment falls within fund timeline
- HUBB tracks carrier progress toward meeting interim and final deployment milestones.
- Carriers with annual deployment milestones may face verification reviews tied to those milestones to confirm deployment to a random sample of reported locations in the months following HUBB deadline
  - Carrier must notify FCC, USAC and state and Tribal governments within 10 business days if it fails to meet a deployment milestone.
  - Carriers found to have missed deployment milestones face increased reporting obligations and potential withholding/recovery of support



# HUBB Portal: Mapping Broadband Deployment

- HUBB dataset is the foundation for the [Connect America Fund \(CAF\) Map](#) and the [Connect America Fund \(CAF\) State Map](#), interactive online maps that show the impact of CAF support on broadband expansion in rural America
  - [CAF Map](#) displays the geographic areas eligible for CAF support and the specific fixed locations where carriers report offering mass-market, high speed Internet service funded by the program
  - [CAF State Map](#) provides a big-picture, state-level view of CAF-supported deployment
- CAF Map and the CAF State Map only reflect deployment data reported by carriers using latitude and longitude coordinates, and do not include deployment reported by carriers using Fabric Location IDs.
  - See the [Broadband Funding Map](#) for deployment obligations and broadband availability coverage (from the [National Broadband Map](#)) for carriers in funds that report deployment data using Fabric Location IDs

# Verification Reviews: Confirming Broadband Deployment

- All carriers participating in CAF programs with defined broadband build-out obligations are subject to **verification reviews** to confirm reported deployment. Verification reviews fall into three main categories:
  - Reviews tied to mandatory annual deployment milestones that begin following the annual March 1 HUBB filing deadline
    - Original/Revised ACAM, ACAM II, CAF II Auction, RDOF and PR/USVI carriers have mandatory 2025 deployment milestones and may face reviews in 2026
  - Reviews conducted at the request of carriers that complete deployment ahead of required milestones (meet optional milestones) and are seeking to reduce Letter of Credit (LOC) values
  - Reviews conducted as part of the FCC Rural Broadband Accountability Plan (RBAP)
    - Can occur before required deployment milestones

**Carriers found to have missed deployment milestones face increased reporting obligations and potential withholding/recovery of support**

# Verification Reviews: Confirming Broadband Deployment (Cont.)

- The goal of the verification review process is to confirm that a carrier deployed broadband service meeting the FCC's performance standards to a qualifying number of locations by the relevant deployment milestone deadline. USAC selects a statistically valid, random sample of locations certified in the HUBB by carriers chosen for review and seeks to verify that:
  - The structure at the reported location is eligible for CAF support
  - The reported service address accurately corresponds with the reported lat/long coordinates
  - The upload and download speeds available are at or above the speeds the carrier must deliver
  - The carrier deployed service at the required speeds in time to meet the deployment milestone
  - The actual number of units or dwellings at the location accurately ties back to the reported number of units or dwellings for the location record

# Verification Reviews: Confirming Broadband Deployment (Cont.)

- Carriers must submit documentation that serves as proof of deployment for each location record selected for verification review. Examples of acceptable documentation include:
  - Subscriber bills
  - Screen shots from public-facing service availability tool showing upload/download speeds available at a particular address
  - Letters of certification certified by an outside engineer licensed by the state (including Professional Engineer number) where service was deployed
  - Screen shots from an internal provisioning system showing the broadband speeds available at a particular service address (and associated geo-coordinates if available)
  - Engineering team emails showing that all locations tied to a particular DSLAM are released to sales for marketing

(Disclaimer: FCC use of verification findings and determinations is without prejudice to any other FCC verification or investigation, including any audit of fixed-broadband-availability data submitted by carriers through the [Broadband Data Collection](#) (BDC). USAC and the FCC may use findings from verifications or audits of BDC data submissions to further assess carrier compliance with CAF deployment obligations.)

# Network Performance Testing: Measuring Speed and Latency

- Ensures that CAF-supported broadband service meets basic performance standards
- Carriers must conduct one week of speed and latency testing at USAC-selected random sample of CAF-supported subscriber locations in each quarter of the year
  - Carriers must submit and certify all test results for all obligated speed tiers for the full sample of selected locations within two weeks of the end of each quarter
- At least 80 percent of speed measurements must be at 80 percent of required speeds and 95 percent of low-latency measurements must fall at or below 100 milliseconds round-trip time
  - FCC considers failure to meet speed and latency standards as a failure to deploy and may withhold support
  - Carriers that fail to conduct the required testing, or fail to submit and certify all required test data by quarterly deadline, may face permanent loss of support

# Network Performance Testing: Measuring Speed and Latency

- Before official testing begins, carriers must conduct a year of quarterly “pre-testing”
  - Carriers must conduct one week of speed and latency pre-testing at USAC-selected random sample of CAF-supported subscriber locations in each quarter of the year
  - Carriers must submit and certify all pre-testing results for all obligated speed tiers for the full sample of selected locations within two weeks of the end of each quarter
  - Carriers do not face withholding of support for failing to meet speed and latency metric during pre-testing if they certify required test results on time each quarter.
- USAC encourages carriers to submit and certify results as soon as pre-testing/testing is complete each quarter and provides quarterly compliance reports to help carriers track their progress in meeting FCC metrics, address shortfalls and submit missing data
  - Compliance reports include details at the SAC level about the percent of upload and download speed tests and latency tests conducted in the quarter that met FCC performance standards

# Tracking Broadband Deployment in the HUBB

# HUBB Portal: Filing by Lat/Long Coordinates and Addresses

- Carriers in these funds (and ACS) have until **March 2, 2026**, to file data for locations deployed in 2025 or certify “no locations to upload,” and report deployment data using **lat/long coordinates and addresses**:
  - **Connect America Fund (CAF) Phase II Auction (CAF II Auction)**
  - **Alternative Connect America Cost Model (Original ACAM), Revised ACAM and ACAM II**
  - **Rural Broadband Experiments (RBE)**
  - **Alaska Plan**
    - Must also submit node and link data for middle-mile fiber and microwave networks
- **CAF BLS** carriers are not required to file in the HUBB for 2025 since the FCC has deferred the start of the next five-year deployment obligation term for CAF BLS carriers
  - CAF BLS carriers should keep their deployment data in the HUBB up to date while the commission considers future CAF BLS deployment obligations and must maintain their coverage footprint

# HUBB Portal: Filing by Fabric Location ID

- Carriers in these funds have until **March 2, 2026**, to file data for locations deployed in 2025 or certify “no locations to upload” and report deployment data using **Fabric Location IDs**:
  - **Enhanced ACAM**
    - Second year reporting deployment data in HUBB using Fabric locations IDs
  - **Rural Digital Opportunity Fund (RDOF)**
    - First year reporting deployment data in HUBB using Fabric locations IDs
    - Also have until March 2, 2026, to submit deployment data using Fabric Location IDs for locations already reported in the HUBB using lat/long coordinates and addresses
  - **Bringing Puerto Rico Together (Uniendo a Puerto Rico) Fund and Connect USVI Fund (PR/USVI Funds) Stage 2 Fixed Support**
    - First year reporting deployment data in HUBB using Fabric locations IDs
    - Also have until March 2, 2026, to submit deployment data using Fabric Location IDs for locations already reported in the HUBB using lat/long coordinates and addresses

# HUBB Portal: Certifying Broadband Deployment

- Carriers have until **March 2, 2026**, to file and certify data for locations deployed with CAF support in 2025
  - Carriers can file and certify locations in the HUBB throughout the year
- Carriers must also complete a separate annual milestone certification in the HUBB between **Jan. 1, 2026, and March 2, 2026**, to confirm that their filing activity for calendar year 2025 is complete
  - As part of this annual certification, carriers that did not deploy any locations in 2025 must still log into the HUBB and certify “no locations to upload” between **Jan. 1, 2026, and March 2, 2026**.
    - “No locations to upload” certification functionality is only turned on in the HUBB **between Jan. 1, 2026, and March 2, 2026**

# HUBB Portal: Certifying Broadband Deployment (Cont.)

- Carriers with 2025 deployment milestones no longer need to complete a separate milestone certification as part of the annual HUBB filing
  - Starting with current filing window, the HUBB automatically completes milestone certifications – including separate milestone certifications for separate deployment obligations by speed tier – for carriers that certify enough locations as part of the annual filing process
- Carriers with 2025 deployment milestones may face verification reviews tied to those milestones to confirm deployment to a random sample of reported locations in the months following the HUBB filing deadline.
  - Carriers that miss a deployment milestone must inform the FCC, USAC and relevant state and Tribal governments within 10 days of the milestone deadline (by early January for year-end milestone deadline)
  - Carriers that miss deployment milestones face increased reporting obligations and potential withholding/recovery of support

# HUBB Portal: Deployment Milestones by Fund

- Carriers in the following funds had mandatory deployment milestones at end of 2025 and may face verification reviews in 2026:
  - **Original ACAM** carriers faced a 90 percent milestone for deploying 10/1 Mbps broadband
  - **Revised ACAM** carriers faced a 90 percent milestone for deploying 10/1 Mbps broadband and a 70 percent milestone for deploying 25/3 Mbps broadband
  - **ACAM II** carriers faced a 70 percent milestone for deploying 25/3 Mbps broadband and were required to meet similar deployment obligations on Tribal lands
  - **PR/USVI** carriers faced a 60 percent milestone for required Stage 2 fixed deployment

# HUBB Portal: Deployment Milestones by Fund (Cont.)

- **CAF II Auction** carriers faced 100 percent milestone for required deployment by end of 2025
  - A CAF II Auction carrier may close out its Letter of Credit (LOC) once USAC verifies that it has deployed service to at least 95 percent of its required location count (See [FCC DA 25-1004](#))
    - Carriers must pass final verification review to be released from LOC obligations
    - Email [HCVerifications@usac.org](mailto:HCVerifications@usac.org) to request a verification review
  - Any CAF II Auction carrier that fails to meet its 100 percent milestone by Dec. 31, 2025, was required to notify the FCC by Jan. 15, 2026
    - Will have a one-year cure period to deploy to remaining locations and must certify this deployment in the HUBB by March 1, 2027, to avoid permanent loss of support
    - Following the March 1, 2027, deadline, any CAF II Auction carrier that has failed to meet the 100 percent milestone but has deployed service to at least 95 percent of its required location count and passed a verification review can accept a pro-rated recovery of support to avoid being found in default of its deployment obligations

# HUBB Portal: Deployment Milestones by Fund (Cont.)

- **RDOF carriers authorized in 2021** faced a 60 percent milestone for required deployments by end of 2025 and **RDOF carriers authorized in 2022 or 2023** faced a 40 percent milestone for required deployments by end of 2025
  - Any RDOF carrier that did not meet its 40 percent deployment milestone by the end of its third year of support or its 60 percent milestone by the end of its fourth year of support must notify the FCC and provide an explanation by Jan. 15, 2026
    - RDOF carriers that miss this milestone are subject to quarterly reporting and withholding of support
  - Any RDOF carrier that has deployed to fewer than 20 percent of required locations by the 40 percent milestone deadline and has not notified the FCC by the following March 1 will be considered immediately in default of program requirements and subject to support recovery, with no grace period (See [FCC DA 25-1039](#))
    - RDOF carriers that default in some authorized areas but continue to receive support elsewhere in a state must comply with this notification requirement.



# HUBB Portal: Late Filings

- Carriers will see a reduction of at least seven days of support for a late HUBB certification. After seven days following the annual filing deadline, USAC will continue to reduce support on a day-by-day basis, plus an additional seven days, until required certification is complete
  - FCC grants a one-time, four-day grace period for a late HUBB certification
- If a carrier discovers locations deployed during prior year that it failed to certify by the HUBB filing deadline, it should submit and certify those locations in the HUBB as soon as possible
  - New FCC rules allow carriers to submit and certify “late-reported locations” and count those locations toward their deployment obligations, but carriers may be subject to support reduction based on number of locations reported late as a percent of total locations reported and number of days after the filing deadline that they are submitted.
    - FCC grants carriers a one-time grace period to certify late-reported without penalty
    - FCC does not reduce support for late-reported locations if a carrier has demonstrated compliance with its final deployment milestone

# HUBB Portal: Filing by Fabric Location ID

## WHAT'S ON THE NATIONAL BROADBAND MAP?

The National Broadband Map consists of 2 datasets, both of which can be challenged:

### FABRIC LOCATIONS

- **What is it?**
  - The Fabric is a dataset of all locations in the United States and Territories where fixed broadband internet access service is or could be installed.
- **Who creates it?**
  - The Fabric is developed by CostQuest in consultation with the FCC and in accordance with FCC rules.
- **Challenges and updates timeline?**
  - The Fabric is updated twice per year.
  - Fabric challenges are accepted on an ongoing basis and successful challenges will be reflected in future Fabric releases.
- **What's on the current map?**
  - The June 2025 version of the Fabric is the base of the current map.

### BROADBAND AVAILABILITY

- **What is it?**
  - Broadband availability data shows what broadband services, if any, are available at locations included in the Fabric, as reported by internet service providers every 6 months.
- **Who creates it?**
  - Internet service providers report their availability data to the FCC every 6 months.
- **Challenges and updates timeline?**
  - Broadband availability data is updated every 2 weeks to reflect challenge outcomes.
  - Challenges are accepted and resolved on an ongoing basis.
- **What's on the current map?**
  - The map shows availability data as-of June 30, 2025, and reflects resolved availability challenges.

# HUBB Portal: Filing by Fabric Location ID

- Broadband Serviceable Location Fabric is a single, standardized dataset of all U.S. locations where fixed broadband access is available or could be installed – with unique ID assigned to each location
  - Foundation for FCC collection of fixed-broadband-availability data through [Broadband Data Collection](#) (BDC) and mapping of fixed-broadband availability on the [National Broadband Map](#)
- FCC also relies on the Fabric to determine deployment obligations for several newer CAF programs and carriers in these funds report deployment based on the Fabric
  - Enhanced ACAM, RDOF, PR/USVI Funds
- Carriers in these funds have access to “required locations” lists – which contain the Location IDs from the Fabric that identify the exact locations where each carrier must offer service – and they report deployment in HUBB using Fabric Location IDs
  - Carriers in these funds do not report lat/long coordinates, addresses, number of units served
- HUBB validates that reported Fabric Location IDs are on a carrier’s list of required locations
  - Carriers must account for every Fabric Location ID on their required locations lists by end of cure period

# HUBB Portal: Filing by Fabric Location ID

- This is the second filing window for **Enhanced ACAM** carriers to submit deployment data in the HUBB using Fabric Location IDs
  - Enhanced ACAM became the first fund to submit deployment data by Fabric Location ID with the HUBB filing window that closed on March 3, 2025
- The FCC recently released the [final lists of Enhanced ACAM eligible locations](#), as of December 30, 2025, and these are now being loaded into the HUBB (See [FCC DA 25-1107](#))
- The HUBB will validate the HUBB filing due March 2, 2026, and all subsequent HUBB filings against each carrier's final list of required locations from its final eligible locations file once the lists are in the system

# HUBB Portal: Filing by Fabric Location ID

- **RDOF and PR/USVI** carriers must submit deployment data by Fabric Location ID for the first time with the current filing window (See [FCC DA 25-32](#) and [FCC DA 25-361](#))
  - The FCC recently released new [interim required locations lists for RDOF carriers](#) and [final required locations lists for PR/USVI carriers](#) (See [FCC DA 25-1081](#))
    - These lists are now being loaded into the HUBB to perform validation checks
  - RDOF and PR/USVI carriers also have until March 2, 2026, to submit deployment data using Fabric Location IDs for locations already reported in the HUBB by lat/long and address
    - All certified RDOF and PR/USVI Funds locations previously reported in the HUBB using lat/long coordinates and addresses are no longer visible to carriers in the system
    - RDOF and PR/USVI carriers can access past deployment data – certified in the HUBB as of Sept. 30, 2025 - through the [CAF Map dataset](#) on [USAC Open Data platform](#)
  - See [FCC website](#) for guidance on RDOF and PR/USVI transition to Fabric ID reporting
  - See [FCC DA 25-1023](#) for details about framework for adjusting required deployment location counts in coming years

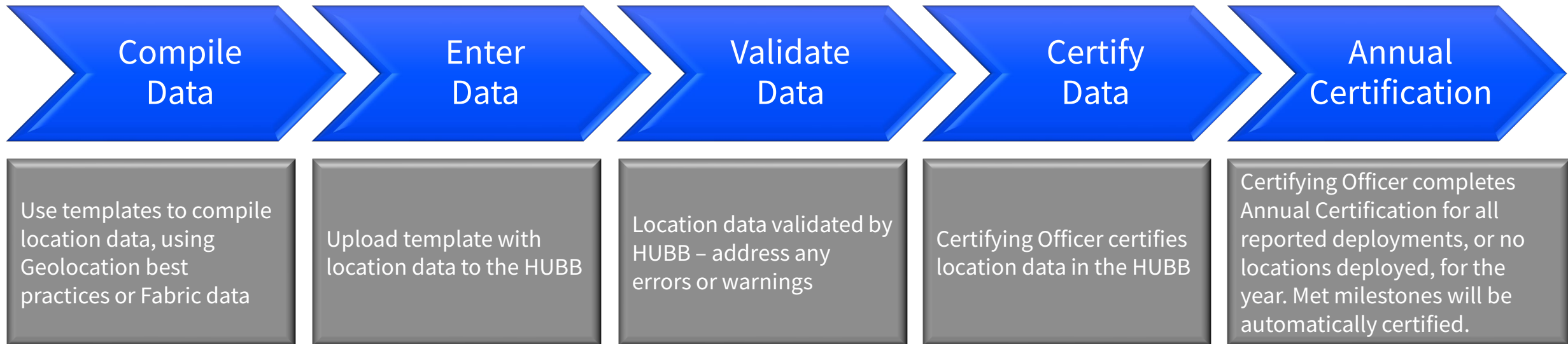

- USAC will delete any certified locations in the HUBB associated with a Study Area Code (SAC) on a previous list if those locations are not on the current list
- USAC will update the number of units associated with a location in the HUBB if the number of units changed between lists

# HUBB Portal: Non-Fabric vs. Fabric Filing

	Non-Fabric	Fabric
Obligations	Carriers must deploy a predetermined number of locations within their authorized area over the life of the fund	Carriers must account for all required authorized locations (Fabric Location IDs) within their authorized area over the life of the fund
Location Reporting	Carriers provide latitude and longitude along with address for each deployed location	Carriers only need to provide the Fabric Location ID for each location
Location Validation	Location must fall within the carrier's authorized area based on its GPS coordinates and not be a duplicate	Location Fabric Location ID must be on the carrier's authorized list and not be a duplicate
Certification	Carriers certify that locations have been deployed according to fund requirements	Carriers certify that locations have been deployed according to fund requirements
CAF Map	Certified locations displayed on CAF Map	Certified locations NOT displayed on CAF Map Carriers also report deployed locations to BDC for display on the National Broadband Map

# HUBB Portal: System Entitlements

  - **HUBB SPO** (Service Provider Officer): allows the user to enter and certify data.
  - **HUBB SPU** (Service Provider User): allows the user to enter but not certify data (typically provided to users inside the carrier).
  - **HUBB SPA** (Service Provider Agent): allows the user to enter but not certify data (typically provided to agents outside the carrier).
- The individual listed as the company officer on the carrier's Form 498 can assign these entitlements. See [USAC's 498 ID webpage](#) for help registering for a Form 498 ID, also called a Service Provider ID (SPIN).
